A Wonderful Testimony

Report of a man from Slovenia who experienced the following in 1975 while working in Bavaria:

„Strictly speaking I had no special relationship to st Joseph. Perhaps it was because I did not know any details about him and because you do not hear anything about him, till someone gave me the book ‘Sankt Joseph, auch dein Helfer’ (‘Saint Joseph, your helper as well’) to read, which filled me with enthusiasm. At this time I was in a desperate situation. I was away on business when I was sent to another place to do several jobs. When I arrived, it turned out that it was more than I could cope with professionally. To be brief: I could not handle the technical plans. A colleague who would have been able to help me turned his back on me and disappeared. So there I was on my own with the plans, inexperienced and devastated. But not for long. I remembered st Joseph for a moment and said to myself: ‚It’s now or never!’ So I implored

him: ‚Good saint Joseph, please help me in this my despair! I cannot even read the plan, let alone work with it. Please help me as there is no one else to help me. There must be a way for me to manage!’

And then the miracle happened! Really: a true miracle! Because after my continuous short prayers: ‚Saint Joseph, help me!’ a light in my mind was beginning to dawn on me. Little by little, without external help, I was able to puzzle out and understand the electric plans, which I saw for the very first time. Day by day things worked out better. Sometimes I asked someone to help me with this or that and behold: I could do the job on my own, reliably and without making any mistakes. When the other arrogant colleagues checked on my work, they gave me a pat on the back and spoke very highly about the good construction. Only now did I feel the nervous strain that I had had for a week. I locked myself up in a room and shed tears of release and gratitude.

St Joseph was my foreman and helped me to do a job which I would have completely failed to do on my own. ‚You kind Patron Saint, how could I ever forget it?! Thank You, thank you ever so much!’“
