St Joseph - Trailblazer for JESUS

In January 1976, Ludwig Lenzen reported on an adventure in China of two Austrian missionaries from the Steyl Mission, Father Götsch and Brother Gervasius:

One day the latter was accompanying the priest to a very sick woman from Kaotai to the South Chinese Qilian Mountains. After an over-200-kilometre, three-day horse ride they reached their destination. The sick woman, however, had already died. Disheartened, the missionaries set off for their post. They were on their way back home when, halfway there, they met a young boy, who was waiting for them on the roadside, and asked them to accompany him to his mother. The boy took them to a little village some ten to fifteen kilometres away. The dying woman was waiting for them in a cob hut and immediately started

asking the priest some strange questions: "Will you, stranger, tell me the truth and answer my questions?" – "But certainly, mother." – "Is there a GOD in three Persons? Is there a place of happiness for all the good ones and a place of terror for all the bad ones in the other life? Is it true that GOD came to this earth to die for the people and open up for them the place of happiness? Stranger, is all of this true?"

Astonished, the priest said yes. From where did this sick person obtain her knowledge? "Well," said the sick woman, "you have some water with you. So wash me that I can enter the place of happiness." How did she know that the priest had baptismal water with him? The determination of the sick woman had something childlike about it and something superior at the same time. Father Götsch gave her a brief instruction and then administered holy Baptism to her. Then, filled with joy, the sick woman shouted: "You do have some Bread with you as well. It is no ordinary bread, but GOD is in it. Give me also some!" The priest carried the Most Blessed Sacrament in a pyx on his breast. The dying woman knew that, too. He gave her Communion and the Sacrament of the holy Anointing of the Sick.

Then he said to her: "So far it was you who asked the questions. Now it is my turn to ask. How did you come by these truths of faith? Did you have previous contact with Catholic or evangelical Christians?" – "No, stranger." – "But you must have read Christian books?" – "I cannot even read, stranger, nor did I know that such books exist." – "But how did you acquire your knowledge of faith?" – "I only thought that it must be so, and I have lived accordingly for nearly ten years. I have also instructed my children accordingly. You can wash (baptise) them all." – "Did you know that we were passing by today?" – "Certainly! I had a dream in which I saw an elderly man.
