

St Josef Helped to Build the Church

The village of Neusserling belongs to the parish of Gramastetten (Austria) and is about eight kilometres away from the parish church. In order to save the elderly and children the trip to church, the parish priest Just decided to celebrate services also in the school building of Neusserling, for the first time on 19 March, 1946, the feast day of St Joseph. Since the school rooms soon became too small because of the good attendance at services, it was decided to build a church in Neusserling. When the construction of the church was in good progress in 1947, it was not yet clear to whom the church should be dedicated: St Joseph, the Holy Family or the Mother of GOD.

Two dozen men were asked to decide on it. After a long discussion, I said: "Men, we have been through a terrible war, but I believe the greatest is yet ahead of us. We could hardly secure a better protection for this terrible time than by consecrating this church to the Immaculate Heart of Mary. The building as such, however, we want to place under the protection of St Joseph." This proposal was unanimously accepted.

Our trust in our builder St Joseph was richly rewarded. Since no craftsmen could be obtained, the foreman worked with unskilled labourers. Suddenly, the progress of construction was called into question because the foreman suffered a broken leg. However, this injury healed so remarkably quickly that it was generally considered a miracle and work did not even have to be interrupted. When the wall had already reached its full height, a worker fell down. Miraculously, he
